



# 2008-2009 Faculty Student Association Operating Budget

## SUNY FREDONIA Faculty Student Association Overview

The Fredonia Faculty Student Association (FSA), incorporated in 1951, is a private corporation governed by the Not-for-Profit Corporation Laws of the State of New York. The bylaws of the corporation detail the purpose, membership, meeting requirement, director responsibilities and specification for the corporation assets and funds. The board of directors consists of five constituent groups represented as follows: (7) Students, (3) Faculty, (3) Administrative Staff, (1) Classified Staff, and (1) Alumni Representative, for a total of (15) directors.

The FSA budget includes Food Service, Bookstore, Vending, Washer and Dryer, Cable TV, College Lodge, Alumni House, FREDCard, and administrative operations. FSA employs

nearly 80 full-time employees, more than 70 part-time and 240 student employees.

Charles Notaro, FSA executive director and Matthew G. Snyder, FSA controller, initially prepared the following 2008-2009 budget in conjunction with other FSA management. The proposed budget was then presented for consultation to the Budget Committee of the FSA Board of Directors. Members of the Committee included the following FSA Board Members: Tracy S. Bennett, Maggie Bryan-Peterson, Cody Meyers, and Jessica Valvo.

## Highlights

The FSA continually works to improve its services to the campus community and respond to various needs of the campus. Some of the highlights from FSA operations over the past several years include:

- The opening of University Commons in Fall 2006 which includes the Cranston Marchè, the Starbucks Cafè, a convenience store and a new bookstore.
- FSA program support of over \$150,000 in the 2007-2008 fiscal year to support 39 different campus-based programs in residence halls, Campus Life and a number of academic and student service departments.
- The Williams Center food court renovation project which is planned to be open for Fall 2008 as the Centre Pointe Lounge.
- Purchase of two new mini-buses (\$80,000) for the campus Park and Ride and Escort van services.
- Payment of over \$300,000 annually to the campus for space and utility charges and institutional program funds.
