2008-2009 State University Tuition Reimbursement Account (SUTRA)

Overview

The State University Tuition Reimbursable Account (SUTRA) budget includes four separate credit-bearing income fund reimbursable types of activities. They include the following:

- Summer Sessions and J-Term
- International Programs
- Contract Courses
- Academic Year (Fall/Spring/J-Term) Overflow Enrollment

The major components of SUTRA on the Fredonia campus include the offices of Lifelong Learning and Special Programs and the International Education Center. The various operations within

SUTRA operate on the SUNY concept of self-sufficiency. Expenditures are capped based on available cash balances which carry forward to the next fiscal year.

The Office of Lifelong Learning and Special Programs is directed by Eric Skowronski. He and his staff are responsible for the university's Summer Sessions, J-Term, Lifelong Learning Credit Program, Non-credit Training and SUNY Learning Network operations.

The mission of Lifelong Learning and Special Programs:

- To promote ongoing personal and professional enrichment, as well as professional skills development and enhancement, to all those served by the university.
- To offer continuing education and training programs that are contemporary, outcomes based, and consistent with the university's strengths and expertise.
- To augment the university's traditional offerings through specialized credit-bearing programs.

Mary Sasso serves as the director of the International Education Center located in LoGrasso Hall. She supervises a staff of two that is responsible for the recruitment of international students, developing and coordinating international study abroad programs and assisting international students attending SUNY Fredonia.
