



Highlights

The SUNY Fredonia Residence Life program has consistently been highly ranked when compared with national peers. In the most recent Association of College and University Housing Officers-International (ACUHO-I) Benchmarking Survey from 2007 which measures student satisfaction, the Residence Life program received the following evaluations from students:

- 81 percent would recommend living on campus to new students.
- 75 percent feel that their housing experience fulfilled their expectations.
- 72 percent feel that living on campus enhanced their learning experience.

Assessment findings consistently indicate that personal interactions (the ability to live cooperatively, meet other people, improve interpersonal relationships, and resolve conflicts) are a key component in predicting a student's overall satisfaction with residence life. Much of the success of the SUNY Fredonia Residence Life program comes from staff efforts to assist students to develop the skills and understanding to participate as productive members of a community with mutual respect and civility toward others. Many programs are offered throughout the academic year to enhance or assist resident

students with these interpersonal skills. A sampling of some of these events from the past year includes the following:

- **Move-in Crew** - 231 students representing 15 student groups assisted residence hall students and their families on move-in day at the start of the fall semester.
- **Little Siblings Weekend** - 258 siblings spent a weekend of activities on campus with their brothers and sisters.
- **Buffalo News Kids Day** - 355 students from 24 student groups raised more than \$3,570 for charity in the Spring 2008 semester.
