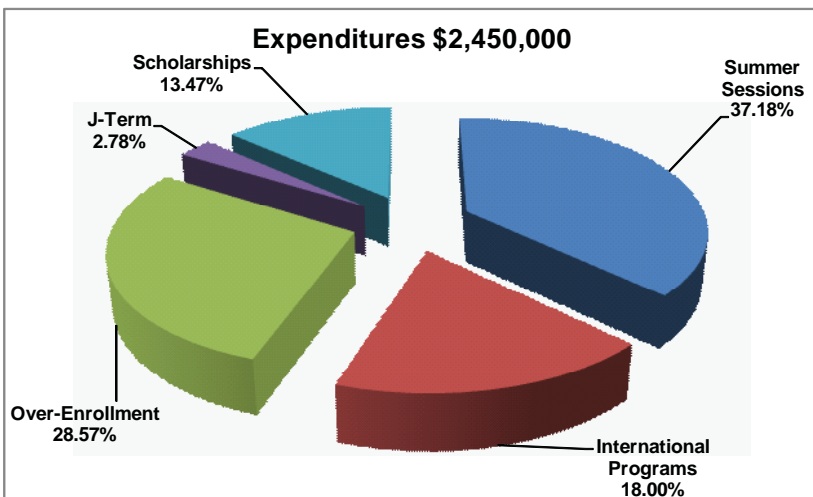
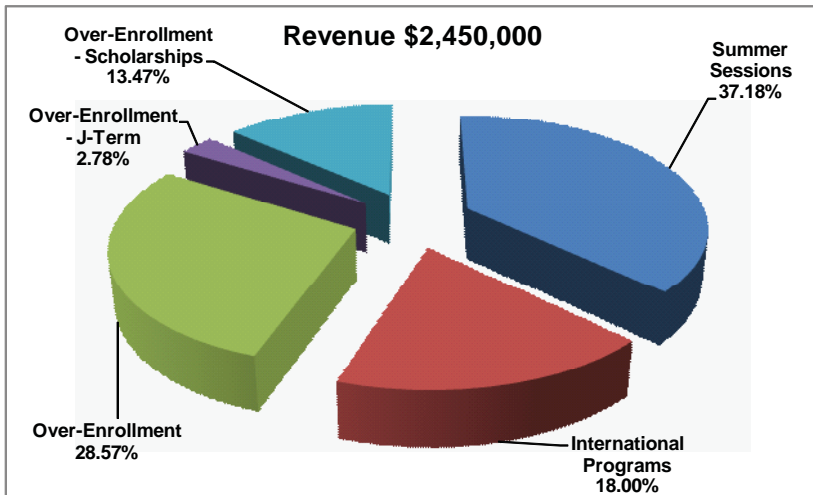

2009-2010 State University Tuition Reimbursable Account (SUTRA)

Overview

The State University Tuition Reimbursable Account (SUTRA) budget includes four separate credit-bearing income fund reimbursable types of activities. They include the following:

- Summer Sessions and J-Term
- International Programs
- Contract Courses
- Academic Year (Fall/Spring/J-Term) Over-Enrollment

The major components of SUTRA on the Fredonia campus include the offices of Lifelong Learning and Special Programs and the International Education Center. The various operations within SUTRA operate on the SUNY concept of self-sufficiency. Expenditures are capped based on available cash balances which carry forward to the next fiscal year.

Lifelong Learning and Special Programs is directed by Eric Skowronski. He and his staff are responsible for the university's Summer Sessions, J-Term, Lifelong Learning Credit Program, Non-credit Training and SUNY Learning Network coordination.
