Highlights

The Office of Lifelong Learning and Special Programs reports directly to the Vice President for Academic Affairs. The office revamped its approach to managing Summer Sessions and J-Term, particularly through enhanced marketing and student-based scheduling. The unit has greatly increased its visibility on campus, making more people aware of its various offerings.

In 2008, the International Education Center initiated two new university agreements: one with Sevilla Superior Conservatory of Music in Spain and one with the Institute for American Universities in Aix en Provence, France. Additionally, a dual diploma program agreement with Izmir (Turkey) University of Economics was approved in the areas of Computer Science and Public Relations. A total of 209 Fredonia students studied abroad in 2007-2008. This is the third year in a row that enrollment in Fredonia-sponsored programs has exceeded enrollment in other SUNY programs.



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Planning Assumptions

Planning assumptions used in the development of the 2009-2010 SUTRA budget include the following:

- Summer Sessions will experience modest growth.
- Summer Sessions will continue to fund four Full Time Equivalent (FTE) positions.
- J-Term revenues will continue to grow.
- Funding will continue for institutional scholarships.
