A swarm is coming! The Beehive Design Collective — a non-profit, volunteer driven, political arts organization based in eastern Maine — is headed this way. The group's mission is to "cross-pollinate the grassroots" through the creation of images as an effective medium for deconstructing and educating the public about complex geopolitical issues. The bees create collaborative, hand-illustrated posters of dizzying intricacy which are patchwork "quilts" of personal stories related to them in their travels by communities in the global south. In their incendiary "Dismantling Monoculture" presentation, the bees take participants on a "tour" through their larger than life graphic trilogy of the multifold effects of globalization, militarism, and resource extraction in the Western Hemisphere. Their stories ricochet from the rampant consumption of the global north, and its impacts on the peoples of Central and South America. Interweaving anecdotes and statistics, they perforate dubious "drug war" rhetoric, expose broad connections between militarism and resource extraction, and expose the anchor of today's global economy as rooted deeply in colonialism.
