Resources

- A robust collection that serves the curricular needs of a primarily undergraduate music population
 - Nearly 18,000 books, including 5,000+ reference volumes
 - Over 25,000 scores and performance parts
 - Over 4,000 compact discs, 12,000 LP records, 900 audiocassettes, and 100 DVDs
- Subscriptions to many of the standard music reference and audio databases, including *Grove Music Online*, *RILM Abstracts*, *Naxos Music Library*, and *DRAM*
- 24 custom audio-visual workstations for listening to CDs, records, or cassettes, or viewing videotapes or DVDs
- A periodic listing (print and online) of new library acquisitions

Services

- Professional reference help for your research needs
- Interlibrary loan of materials for current faculty and students
- Wireless connectivity throughout Reed Library for laptop usage

For Instructors

- You may request items to be placed on course reserve for your students' use. Books, scores, and recordings are shelved at the Music Desk; journal articles are scanned and placed on each professor's ANGEL course space. To place items on reserve, fill out a Reserves Request form, available at the Music Desk or online at the library's website.
- Individual or classroom instruction on library resources is available anytime during the semester — click on one of the online request form links on the library website to schedule a class time.
