For over ten years of invested trust and sustained cooperation and support, I herewith express my most profound appreciation to the past and present administrators of the Society. I

also wish to thank the several secretaries and assistants for taking my capricious appearance in good humored stride, and brightening many a troubled day with their help and always present understanding smiles. I just wish I would have made fewer mistakes.

**Holland Land Company Collections and related material at the
Buffalo and Erie County Historical Society**

The preservation of Holland Land Company documents at the Buffalo and Erie County Historical Society is of major importance, because the Society houses the “Joseph Ellicott Correspondence”, which is an integral part of the Archives of the Holland Land Company. Without it, the Archives is incomplete. The Correspondence contains letters to and from Joseph Ellicott during his tenure as Chief Surveyor and Resident Agent of the Holland Land Company. In 1821, at the termination of his employment, Ellicott removed his letters from the Batavia Land Office. In 1822, the Court of Chancery in Albany* decided that Ellicott had legal rights to the Correspondence. In 1873, a member of the family, Ellicott Evans donated the 21 volume set to the Society.

Throughout the years the Buffalo and Erie County Historical Society pioneered in collecting documents relating to the Holland Land Company, the Holland Purchase and its people. A large variety of documents and some studies appeared in the Society's series, called Publications. The following volumes concentrate specifically on the activities of the Holland Land Company:

Volume 14: THE HOLLAND LAND COMPANY AND CANAL CONSTRUCTIONS IN WESTERN NEW YORK, 1910.
Many of the letters were selected from the Joseph Ellicott Correspondence and the Charles Worthington Evans Collection.

Volume 28: Paul Demund Evans, THE HOLLAND LAND COMPANY, 1928.
It is the only full length historical study of the Company's operation in the United States.

Volumes 32 and 33: REPORTS OF JOSEPH ELLICOTT, edited by Robert W. Bingham, 1937 and 1941.

The two volumes contain transcript versions of the report of the Grand Survey of the Holland Purchase, related correspondence, and the annual reports of the Batavia Land Office between 1800-1835.

The Society houses several large collections that contain various amounts of related personal papers of individuals who were employed by, or dealt extensively with the Holland Land Company.

The most noteworthy of these are the:

Cary Family Papers that include the “Trumbull Cary Papers;” *SEE: BUF 137, Reels 24 & 25*

The George Hunter Bartlett Papers, that include the “Legal and Business Papers” of William Peacock and some miscellaneous material of the Peacock, Ellicott and Evans families;

Peter B. Porter Papers, that include a group of “Holland Land Company” documents. This collection had been microfilmed. *SEE BUF 136*

Depending on funds, these Collections, at least in part, should be microfilmed at a later date.

Other smaller groups of letters and miscellaneous papers of Company employees and the “Book of Notes and Observations made of Tonawanda Swamp... to the Headwaters of Black Creek,” in 1816, by William Peacock, will be filmed in the near future with similar minor collections at nearby repositories.

The most significant collections at the Society, the Holland Land Company Records, the Henry Glowacki Papers, and the Charles W. Evans Collection are herewith microfilmed.

Although historical evidence clearly indicates that these three Collections arrived at the Society at different times from several donors, throughout the years they were intermingled. An attempt was made to reconstruct the original grouping for the microfilming, as much as possible, in order to present the documents in an historically appropriate sequence. In the process of dividing the documents among the three Collections some speculative assumptions had to be made. Without original donor lists it was impossible to tell, for instance, whether the Joseph Ellicott letter copybooks were donated independently, or they arrived from Batavia with the Glowacki Papers. The volumes were added to the “Ellicott Correspondence” because historically they belong there. Other problems surfaced when the individual documents were assigned to groups within a collection. Lack of time and limited insight also made it difficult to identify unlabeled, or occasionally mislabeled documents. Therefore, the Editor’s assigned document titles and final groupings may reflect some error in judgement.

The Holland Land Company Records are dated from 1790 to 1837. The major portion is the already explained “Joseph Ellicott Correspondence,” containing 21 volumes of original letters that were received in the Batavia Land Office. Certain volumes also contain reports, statements, miscellaneous notes, and a couple of maps. Although within the originally unnumbered volumes consistent chronological sequence is not maintained, the volumes are listed in order by inclusive dates. Earlier assigned volume numbers are not used. An inconsistently arranged name index is available in each volume. The copybooks of outgoing letters, that were generally copied by clerks, are more orderly and are easier to read. With the exception of part two in the third volume, name indexes are available.

The “Land Sales Records” group contains almost exclusively copies of Articles of Agreements and contract ledgers for land sold in and around the City of Buffalo. They may have

been donated to the Society by the family of a Holland Land Company employee in the Buffalo Land Office. Documents in other groups are explained in the respective “notes”. The Scrap Book by N.K.Hall contains pamphlets and other memorabilia, some of which are duplicated elsewhere in the collections. In order to preserve this gift in its original format it was filmed in its entirety under “Miscellaneous Material.”

The Henry Glowacki Papers span between 1795 and 1860. They were bequeathed to the Buffalo Historical Society in 1892 by Henry I. Glowacki, a Batavia lawyer;* hence is derived the name of the Collection. Glowacki was the attorney for Jacob Le Roy and Heman Redfield, proprietors, who in 1835 bought from the Holland Land Company most of the unsold land and outstanding assets mainly in Erie, Genesee, Niagara and Orleans Counties. The new proprietors raised the purchase money by obtaining mortgage from the Farmers' Loan and Trust Company. The most valuable portion of this Collection is an almost complete portfolio of numbered land transfer records that are listed and filmed under that group heading. The Collection also contains other miscellaneous land transfer and financial documents that reveal the complex tripartite agreement among the Holland Land Company, Le Roy and Redfield, and the Farmers' Loan and Trust Company. The purchase transaction was completed in 1838 when the Holland Land Company received final payment.

The Collection also contains a large variety of miscellaneous material under that group heading, and some original documents, or copies of land transactions between Massachusetts and various owners of the pre-emption land in Western New York. For the convenience of researchers who wish to concentrate on this wider aspect of regional land transfers, pertinent

items are listed under group heading, "New York/ Massachusetts Pre-emption Related Documents."

Similar rationalization dictated the separate listing of documents that appear under "Indian Affairs." Admittedly, the majority of this material related only remotely to the activities of the Holland Land Company in this region. Most items deal with later dated land sales on the Indian Reservation, resulting problems and published law cases. These documents are in the Collection because Henry Glowacki and his partner Joshua Brown handled some of the law cases and coordinated certain arrangements with the United States War Department, Office of Indian Affairs. This small group of documents, many of which are copies, reveal the intricate and troublesome relationship between the settlers and the Seneca Indians during the 1840s and 1850s. Therefore, they add richness to the already valuable preserved material.

This Collection contains a volume in which eight unrelated pamphlets are bound together. In an effort to leave the volume intact yet not to upset the alphabetical listing, the pamphlet titles are listed in proper sequence with a note added "bound with other printed documents." They appear under BUF - 52,-53,-58,-62,-63,-67,-68, and-98.

Charles W. Evans Collection

Charles Worthington Evans, a Buffalo lawyer, held power of attorney for several members of the Ellicott, Evans and Peacock families. He married William Peacock's niece Mary, thus perpetuating the expanding family dynasty. The couple had access to a variety of family documents, a sizable portion of which constitutes this Collection. The Peacock Papers and other valuable documents were later donated by their descendants and are part of the George Hunter Bartlett Papers.

The Collection dates from 1701 to 1871. It contains about 250 letters between Joseph Ellicott and a number of agents of the Holland Land Company and neighboring land companies, political figures, settlers and family members. Several original sketches of Ellicott's survey reports and his speech to the Indians at the Buffalo Creek Reservation in 1798 are also here. As with other collections some miscellaneous unrelated documents are likewise presented. With the exception of the correspondence, the documents are stamped "C.W. Evans Collection," which precluded speculation as to what items should be included.
