Databases:

Academic Search Complete: A multidisciplinary databases of more than 6,100 periodicals with coverage for some journals going back to 1887. A great starting place for research.

ERIC : Provides access to education literature and resources, including more than 1,194,000 records and links to more than 100,000 full text documents.



CIOS (Communication Abstracts): Provides citations and summaries of articles in the field of Communication.

Oxford Reference: includes over 175 titles language and subject reference works from the *Oxford Companions* and *Oxford Dictionaries* series, plus the *Visual English Dictionary*, the *Oxford Dictionary of Quotations* and the *Encyclopedia of Mammals*

Using InterLibrary Loan

Use InterLibrary Loan services to acquire materials that are not available at Reed Library or full text online. The library often can get electronic materials in 2 days or less and books in 3-5 days. To learn more about InterLibrary Loan, go to:
