Specific databases available for Education include:



EBSCOHost Databases:

Education Research Complete: This database offers one of the largest and most complete collections of full text education journals and covers scholarly research and information relating to all area of education from early childhood to higher education, and educational specialties.

ERIC: Contains annotated references to educational materials online.

Professional Development Collection: Provides a collection of electronic information especially for professional educators, and education researchers.



ScienceDirect contains high quality peer reviewed journals from Elsevier publishing journals.

JSTOR Provides a comprehensive backfile of major scholarly journals in the Arts and Sciences, Business, Ecology & Botany, General Science, Language & Literature, and Music. Journals are not current, most having a "moving wall" or "embargo" of three to five years, depending on publication.



Using InterLibrary Loan

Use InterLibrary Loan services to acquire materials that are not available at Reed Library or full text online. The library often can get electronic materials in 2 days or less and books in 3-5 days. To learn more about InterLibrary Loan, go to:
