Specific databases available for Communication Disorders include:



EBSCOHost Databases:

CINAHL Plus with Full Text: Contains full-text peer reviewed articles in the allied health fields

Medline: the standard search tool from the National Library of Medicine

Academic Search Complete: This general purpose resources is great for beginning research

PsycInfo: Citations and summaries of psychology topics. Also includes the psychological aspects of medicine, psychiatry, nursing, and speech pathology.



ScienceDirect contains high quality peer reviewed journals from Elsevier publishing journals.

Gale Virtual Reference Library: A database of encyclopedias and specialized reference sources for multidisciplinary research.



Health and Wellness Center: A source for both health care professionals and consumers concerning important current health information.

Using InterLibrary Loan
