## Note from the President

**Commencement.** On May 18, Fredonia graduated its largest class ever, led by Faculty/Staff Marshals Jean Harper, Clara Beier, Jane Jackson, and Terry Mosher, as well as Mace Bearer Alan LaFlamme.

**Incoming students.** With so many students graduating—a good thing!—and the high school population in Western New York decreasing, we've been especially challenged this year to address the issues of enrollment. I'm happy to report, however, that we currently have more than 1,100 first-year students who have deposited to reserve a place in the entering class for Fall 2013, and we continue to build the entering class of transfer students.

Academic quality. I am most excited to know that as we exceeded our target for the first-year students, the selectivity is even higher than previous years. It's important to me that we recruit academically strong students, and this year's entering class demonstrates that well!

**Scholarships and gifts.** Many of you support the Annual Fund and contribute regularly to endowments that provide scholarships for Fredonia students. Your efforts have made a big difference this year in our recruiting efforts, and I'm grateful for your support.

**Progress on campus initiatives.** Over the spring semester, the Campus Initiatives Roundtable met monthly to be sure that leaders of various initiatives provided updates that prevented groups from working in isolation or duplicating/contradicting one anothers' efforts. Included in this Roundtable are the Chair of the University Senate, leaders of active teams/committees (Mission Statement, General Education, Baccalaureate Goals, Engagement, and Power of Fredonia Strategic Plan), and Cabinet members. We will continue this useful model next year.

**Construction update.** The Science Center continues to progress, moving on schedule toward a completion date of February/March 2014 and classes scheduled in the building in Fall 2014. Please check the website to see the building as it is built! The design work and specifications for the addition to the Rockefeller Arts Center are complete, but because of funding allocation delays at the state level, the actual construction is not expected to begin until Spring 2014. The design is impressive, and we will be eager to get started! A new fitness center—in the old Dods Pool area—opened in January, and over 800 students used the facility each day of the spring semester!

**SAVE THE DATE!** Last August, I was glad to welcome so many members of the Emeritus Faculty and Staff to the annual Beginning of the Year celebration at the President's House. Please mark your calendars for that event this year on Friday, August 23, at 7:00. My office will send you a more formal invitation as the date approaches. I hope you can come!
