Community COVID-19 Testing Site in Jewett Hall

As you may have heard, SUNY Fredonia is one of several SUNY campuses hosting a COVID-19 community test site. The Fredonia location in Jewett Hall is open Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. People from the community will be visiting campus to use this service. It is also available to students. However, students are encouraged to use our regular pool testing available on Monday and Tuesday from 12 p.m. to 4 p.m. in Steel Hall. Parking Lot 13 (the Jewett Hall lot) is closed to students and employees so it can be used for public parking for COVID-19 testing.

I informed you in December that the campus safety bus would be reinstated and be back in operation this spring semester after being discontinued several years ago. I asked for suggestions for naming the bus. Several good suggestions were received, and we wanted to give the campus the chance to be heard.
