


Award Letter: A means of notifying financial aid applicants of the assistance being offered. The award letter usually provides information in the types and amounts of aid offered, as well as specific program information, student responsibilities and the conditions which govern the award. The letter provides students with the opportunity to accept or decline the aid offered.

<u>Bill:</u> The bill is sent out several weeks before the beginning of the semester. It includes mandatory charges, a list of optional items, and approved financial aid credits. A statement is sent out when necessary during the semester, which reflects the student's optional item selections and the status of the student's account.

<u>Budget:</u> The estimated cost of attendance for an institution; usually includes tuition, fees, books, supplies, room, board, personal expenses, and transportation. Other expenses may be included.

<u>Campus Based Financial Aid Programs:</u> The Federal Perkins Loan, the Federal Supplemental Education Opportunity Grant, and the Federal Work Study Programs. These three programs are called "campus based" because the funds are administered directly by the college's Financial Aid Office, which awards these funds to students using federal guidelines.

<u>Financial Aid Package</u>: The combination of financial aid funds (loans, grants, scholarships, and employment) awarded to an individual student by a college.

Financial Need: The difference between the student's cost of attendance and the expected family contribution.

<u>Grace Period</u>: The period of time that begins when a loan recipient ceases to be enrolled at least half-time and ends when the repayment period starts. Loan principal need not be paid and interest does not accrue during this period.
