Each office of the division, along with our campus partners, was involved in a collaborative process that led to a new divisional philosophy of creating pathways for all students to succeed

### **Points of Pride - Significant Achievements**

- 1. Re-organized divisional into a comprehensive student services operation.
- 2. Enrolled second largest and most diverse entering class in Fredonia's history.
- 3. Created a personalized intervention model to assist students who are experiencing personal and social challenges.
- 4. Developed **Destination to a Dream**, a collaborative partnership with Jamestown College College providing opportunity to student seeking admissions into a four-year higher education institution.
- 5. Celebrated **Campus Food Pantry** selection as a SUNY Best Practice Program for Non-Traditional Students.
- 6. Expanded and re-named Center for Multicultural Affairs to include all multicultural student organizations. The new center increased from six student groups to 15 student organizations and is called **The Intercultural Center**.
- 7. Increased students residing in on-campus housing by more than 20%.
