The SUNY Urban Teacher Education Center (SUTEC) opened in 2001 with the enthusiastic endorsement of the SUNY and NYC Schools Chancellors. SUTEC is dedicated to collaborating with campus faculty and administrators on field placements, organizing seminars for students and faculty, and facilitating the New York City Board of Education’s recruitment of teachers from SUNY Institutions.

SUTEC’s primary mission is to assist the 17 SUNY campuses that offer teacher preparation programs, securing student teaching placements for more than 100 students annually.

Highly qualified college supervisors are experienced and successful teachers or administrators from NYC schools.



For student teachers placed by SUTEC in city schools who do not have living accommodations with family, or who do not make living arrangements on their own, SUNY/SUTEC will lease a number of two-bedroom apartments in the Parkchester Complex in the Bronx. SUTEC-sponsored housing in NYC will be at the same cost as the dorm cost for the semester at the local campus.
