The initial endowment of \$25,000 was created in spring of 2000 by the Ralph Wilson, Jr., Foundation to assist EDP

students with book and other college expenses. Applicants must submit a 300 word essay as well as a list of their accomplishments and community service activities. The essay, academic merit, and economic need are reviewed by the EDP counseling staff. This award is offered each semester. The total amount of awards presented is currently at \$17,890.



EDP CULTURAL CONNECTIONS PROJECT

Annually, the campus's Faculty Student Association (FSA) supports various university activities that enhance the educational and/or cultural experiences of the campus community. The FSA funds are used for purposes that will

benefit the principal educational mis-

sion and goals of Fredonia. The FSA Board of Directors reviews requests for support in March of each year for the following June 1-May 31. EDP has submitted requests since 2007 and has been very fortunate to have received a total of \$17,500 over eight years. Through the FSA grant, EDP is able to fund its alumni speakers series and other special receptions, honor society induction, annual awards ceremony, on and off campus theatre/music/cultural events, community service, CPR trainings, and summer orientation cultural excursions, among other things. These events are well attended and unify EDP's students and staff with a greater sense of togetherness and pride for EDP.

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SUPPLEMENTAL INSTRUCTION

Each semester EDP offers Supplemental Instruction (SI) courses for its students. These SI classes help EDP students develop analytical, quantitative, and problem solving abilities; communication proficiencies; and study and test taking skills necessary to successfully master course material. SI courses are linked to general education courses and expose first-year students to introductory courses in a variety of academic fields. Courses are credit bearing and taught in a small group setting by the parent course instructor. Research has found this environment to be conducive for learning and retention of course material and encourages student participation in classes. Two sections of Biology Study Skills were offered for the fall and one section will be offered for the spring, all taught by Dr. Bruce Tomlinson, Associate Professor of Biology.

TUTORING SERVICES AVAILABLE

EDP tutoring services were extremely busy for the fall 2014 semester. Tutoring sessions are conducted out of the University's Learning Center, 4th floor of Reed Library. All students are strongly encourage to utilize tutoring and

should contact their EDP counselor to complete a tutee application. If any EDP students are having difficulties in a course, or wish to have a better understanding of course material, they may requests one-on-one assigned tutoring or go to drop-in tutoring hours in the Learning Center. Tutors are all current university students who are available to EDP from the College Tutoring Services (CTS). A day-long training for all tutors was conducted at the College Lodge on September 6, 2014, and a spring training will take place on January 24.

Students interested in being a 2015-16 tutor may apply now. Applications are due by March 13.

EVALUATION AND ASSESSMENT

In 2001 Campus Labs (formerly StudentVoice) was



formed to collect information from stuused to impact pro-

grams and services. Campus Labs is utilized by over 650 campuses, coordinating assessment on every level.

Each semester EDP surveys tutors, tutees, graduating seniors, SI Biology class participants, and the EDP Orientation class via CampusLabs. Each spring counseling surveys are sent to all EDP students. Results are assessed by the EDP staff and used to enhance student services. EDP also sends fourth week evaluations to each student's professors. The feedback provided by instructors in advance of ninth week mid-semester grades, informs the counselors regarding attendance, participation, and academic progress. This information assists in providing timely advice and guidance to students regarding the individual level of engagement necessary to be successful in the classroom.

2014 WALLACE SCHOLARSHIP AWARDED

The fifth annual <u>Wallace Scholarship</u> was presented to **Krystal Lebron** (JR/Biology/Dunkirk), **Rachael James** (SR/ Comm-Public Relations/Bronx), **Rebecca Chatterton** (SR/Visual Arts and New Media/Oswego), and **Jelissa Lebron** (JR/Comm-Communication Studies/Brooklyn) *(pictured below left to right)* in August. They are all featured in the September <u>Student Spotlight</u>.

Applicants for the Wallace Scholarship are EDP students in good academic standing (minimum 2.50 CUM GPA) who have earned a minimum of 50 credit hours, have a minimum of one semester remaining after receiving the scholarship, and demonstrate evidence of campus and program leadership. A 500-600 word essay is required which includes a



description of successes and challenges while at Fredonia and how EDP has been instrumental in achieving such goals. Each scholarship is in the amount of \$500. The EDP staff recommends students to the scholarship committee consisting of Emma McFayden '76, Keith McFayden '77, Dr. Sherryl Weems '76, Dr. Jawaan Wallace, and Dr. Jeffrey J. Wallace '68.

The EDP staff will select the next set of nominees in February with the scholarship being presented during the EDP Alumni & Friends Reunion April 24-26.

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PREPARATION FOR "JEWEL" 2015

The Educational Development Program sponsors a **first-year student workshop** (JEWEL—July EDP Workshop for Expanded Learning) designed to acquaint new students with the EDP staff and participate in enrichment activities to prepare them for their college experience. <u>The 2015 JEWEL is TENTATIVELY scheduled for July 9-24.</u>

Students arrive on campus for the university's two-day new student orientation. Here they are introduced to the university, its faculty,

staff, and services. There is also a specialized orientation for parents. During these two days students meet with an advisor and register for their fall 2015 classes in addition to attending presentations on topics such as financial aid, the billing process, and on-campus services. Details on the 2015 university's new student orientation will be available soon online at

Upon completing the university's orientation, students remain on campus for JEWEL where workshops include:

- An introduction to the philosophy, goals, policies, and procedures of the Educational Development Program in order to help the student become more familiar with the EDP Family.
- A discussion of the policies and procedures governing financial assistance to help the student gain a better understanding of the financial assistance available to the student and how to utilize them.



- A review of academic policies and expectations of the college to help the student become more familiar and connected to Fredonia.
- Descriptions of various administrative and academic departmental offices and key personnel which will give the student an extra edge as they begin their college career.



- Academic advisement to provide additional interactions between the students and their EDP counselor.
- Team building activities, enhancement workshops, and leadership courses.
- Courses in math, writing, science, and public speaking.

<u>JEWEL</u> is the first step of the on-going process that will help EDP students excel in their academic standing. The July workshop is found to give students a better idea of why they are here and what must be accomplished to be successful.

Guiding these new first-year students are current EDP students who serve as JEWEL peer advisors; graduate interns; and instructors in math, writing, science, and public speaking. Guest speakers' topics range from civic engagement, campus technology, tutoring assistance, and leadership. EDP first-year students continue their intensive study skills work with EDP's orientation class in the fall and spring semesters. These courses are

EDP's orientation class in the fall and spring semesters. These courses taught by EDP's counselors.

The fee, meal, and lodging costs during the orientation are covered for each student by contributions from Fredonia and a grant from the <u>Office</u> <u>of Opportunity Programs in Albany</u>. It is <u>mandatory</u> that all EDP first-year students attend both the university's orientation and JEWEL.

Items needed to complete an application are:

- high school transcript or GED

- personal interview with the EDP director or counselor

• two letters of recommendation (e.g., from a guidance counselor, teacher, club leader, employer, etc.)

 autobiographical essay (relate life circumstances which make one a good candidate for EDP)

• income verification (e.g., signed copies of the 2014 federal parents' taxes and student's taxes (if filed) including W-2 forms)

• if taxes are not filed, then a social security statement, social services statement, etc., will need to be submitted - see Question #8 on the Eligibility Information Form for more details

• if public assistance is received, please complete and submit the Public Assistance Benefits Verification Form -(286kb)

CPR/AED TRAINING FOR EDP STUDENTS

EDP will offer CPR/AED (cardiopulmonary resuscitation and automated external defibrillator) training for

GRADUATE OPPORTUNITY PROGRAM

Educational Development Program/EDP (also known state-wide as the Educational Opportunity Program/EOP) undergraduates benefit from a variety of support services (academic advising, financial aid, computer lab, supplemental instruction, summer orientation, orientation class, etc.). As graduates of EDP/EOP, students are eligible for the EOPGOP. The EOP Graduate Opportunity Program provides financial assistance to cover tuition to EOP graduates undertaking graduate study at a participating SUNY graduate and/or professional institution when attending full-time. Students must apply and be admitted to a participating campus prior to approval of Graduate Opportunity Program funding. Documentation of a student's prior status as an opportunity program student is also required. Students who are interested in graduate study are encouraged to consult with their undergraduate program director. Early application to the campus of choice is encouraged as funding is limited.

Applicants must be:

• New York State residents

• Graduates of SUNY's Educational Opportunity Program (EOP) or of City University of New York's Search for Education, Elevation, and Knowledge (SEEK) Program or of the Higher Educational Opportunity Program (HEOP) conducted by private colleges

• Accepted into a master's program (matriculated) and registered as full-time students

Applicants must:

• Complete the <u>Certification of Participation form</u> and have it confirmed by the institution granting the bachelor's degree

File a FAFSA renewal

DEDICATED COMPUTER LAB/ STUDY HALL FOR EDP STUDENTS

The EDP computer lab is located across the corridor from EDP staff offices. The eight terminals are maintained by the University's <u>Information Technology Services</u> (<u>ITS</u>). Students may also certainly use the many other <u>open computer labs across campus</u>.

This computer lab is one of several locations where required study hall takes place. Study hall is one part of EDP's student support services, providing a structured study time for first-year students, students currently on academic probation, and those nearing academic risk. Students may complete their study hall requirements in the EDP computer lab and/or in designated classrooms. Upperclass EDP students proctor the evening study hall sessions.

"These study sessions provide our students with the opportunity to complete homework assignments, write papers, and prepare for exams in an environment that is free of distractions and conducive to improving their academic standing. Regardless of whether students are obligated to attend, we encourage all of our students to take advantage of study hall," said EDP Director David White.
