The assessment process for the Fine arts employed an independent test for the Visual Arts based upon the slide projection of a Toulouse Lautrec. Theater and Communication and English employed the Little Red Riding Hood Test advocated by the assessment committee.

Major findings of this assessment:

The students did exceedingly well on the assessment of their ability to understand an artistic work and the creative process connected to it. 88% of the students who took a college core curriculum arts course met or exceeded the standard. The standard is the minimal level of performance that students ought to exceed at this point in their education.

Action to be taken in addressing these assessment findings:

Recommended: SUNY-Fredonia arts faculty should continue using their current teaching methods. Student performance was strong on content and understanding of the relevant concepts. The percentage of the students meeting or exceeding the standard remained constant with the last assessment evaluation. The variation between the two evaluations 2006 and 2010, respectively, is the inclusion of Communication and English and the absence of the Music evaluation. The 2010 results indicate a successful use of teaching methods and consistent outcome results.

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
