ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

To be considered for the Study Abroad Ambassador Program, applicants must:

- Be a full-time Fredonia student in good academic standing
- Have completed a study abroad program prior to applying
- Be responsible and reliable
- Be able to represent the Office of International Education (OIE) in a professional manner

DUTIES & RESPONSIBILITIES

Study Abroad Ambassadors will:

- Commit to one semester of service as an Ambassador
- · Attend mandatory training sessions and monthly meetings
- Communicate with professors to organize and facilitate classroom visits; attend the required number of classroom visits assigned each semester
- Assist OIE with programs and recruitment events (Open Houses, Study Abroad 101, fairs, pre-departure orientation, etc.)
- Attend at least one social or volunteer program organized by OIE and/or the Lead Study Abroad Ambassador
