Please Register for Classes--Temporary Suspension of All Holds

Any hold will need to be addressed prior to the start of fall 2020, but will not interfere with online registration this spring because of the unusual and unforeseen circumstances students and their families are facing.

Credits/Refunds

Once all credits are fully calculated and reviewed, they will be loaded into student accounts. This process has been time-consuming, but is nearly complete. Please read carefully Distance Education Memo #5, which will be distributed next Monday, April 20 to learn exactly how credits/refunds will be handled by SUNY Fredonia, in accordance with SUNY guidelines.
