

# Campus Hazing Transparency Report

SUNY Fredonia as of July 1, 2025

The Stop Campus Hazing Act (SCHA) is a piece of legislation that became law in December 2024 that requires, among other things, institutions develop and distribute a Campus Hazing Transparency Report (CHTR, or "Report") and report hazing statistics in the Annual Security Report as required by the Clery Act.

## SUNY Fredonia's Hazing Policy & Procedure

#### REPORTING PROCESS

SUNY Fredonia encourages the reporting of incidents of hazing and takes each report seriously. It will investigate all reports diligently and thoroughly, in accordance with the <u>Student Code of Conduct</u> and/or other applicable policies and procedures. Any person may report an incident of hazing in person, by mail, by telephone or electronic mail, using the contact information listed for the Office of Student Conduct or by utilizing Fredonia's reporting system, found <u>here</u>. Individuals may also report incidents of hazing to a campus administrator, a campus office, University Police, or local law enforcement.

#### CAMPUS HAZING TRANSPARENCY REPORT

Per the SCHA, SUNY Fredonia will compile and publish relevant and pertinent information<sup>1</sup> regarding each incident of hazing for which a recognized student organization was found responsible. Beginning July 1, 2025; this information will be collected and subsequently published (and updated) twice a year<sup>2</sup>.
